Establishment of Nepal Health Research Council in the year 1991

- Autonomous government body by an act of parliament
 - Regulation of health research in the country
 - Health research capacity building of the researcher
 - Evidence generation
 - Promoting the use of evidences







NHRC ACT 1991

3. Establishment of Council: (1) The Nepal Health Research Council is hereby established to do, or cause to be done, high-level study and research works on health.

11. Permission to be Obtained to do Research Relating to Health:


- (I) After the commencement of this Act, Individual or organization interested to do research in the field of health shall have to Obtain permission from the Council.
- (II) The Council may also specify terms and conditions as prescribed while giving permission pursuant to sub- section (I).
- 12. Special Rights of the council: (1) The Council may issue necessary directives to the person or organization involved in the research work relating to health permitted for research pursuant to Section 11.
- (2) In case any person or organization carries out research works without obtaining permission pursuant to Section 11 or does not abide by the terms and conditions as prescribed or directives of the Council, while carrying out the research work by obtaining permission, the council may warn such person or organization or prohibit to carry out the research work for a specified period.

Challenges

- Lack of Harmonized System / Procedure
- Inadequate HR and infrastructure
- Less coordination and collaboration with Academia
- Lack of budget
 - Voluntary work
 - To run the EC
 - Regular capacity-building training and refresher training





Compliance with Guidelines

- ▶ **Initial review:** fulfilments of the requirements, identifying the level of risk,
- ▶ **Implementation:** compliance with the approved protocol, Guidelines, SOPs
- **Post-approval**: Report submission, dissemination, authorship, post-research access, and benefit sharing





Possible Recommendations

- Promoting harmonized system and procedure (Like FERCAP criteria)
 - Develop a signal online system for other ECs
 - Joint review and monitoring along with mentoring on research
 - Strengthen the infrastructure and HR capacity, promoting collaborative and multi-disciplinary research in priorities area
 - Open Data Sharing and Ownership/IPR, Post-trial access, and benefit sharing
 - Promote engaging the community in the research process
- Conduct Regular short training programs
 young researchers and refresher training for EC members and reviewers
- Consider putting it in the curriculum in all disciplines
- In-house short talks, discussions, or seminars
